

Grant Opportunities

2013 was a banner year for Potlatch Fund's grantmaking program. With recommendations from our grantmaking committees and Board of Directors, 100 grants -totaling \$376,500- were made in support of Native-led programs and projects across our Northwest service area of Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Montana! We also experienced a surge of applications that helped Potlatch Fund achieve its goal of making grants in all four states, across our region, with substantial increases to Montana and Oregon.
