Potlatch Fund is accepting applications for a full-time Grants Manager to work out of the Seattle office. Potlatch Fund currently awards approximately 100 grants, on an annual basis, to Native nonprofits, Tribal programs, and Native artists through four grant programs: Intertribal Canoe Journey, Community Building, Native Arts, Language Preservation and Education. The Grant Manager will be responsible for ensuring that all of Potlatch Fund's grantmaking programs run efficiently and effectively while also allowing for increased organizational capacity.


This cohort-based training program is part of our ongoing efforts at increasing philanthropy in Northwest Indian Country through the education of philanthropic entities and Native-led nonprofits. In essence, the Capacity Building Program is about our people, empowering emerging leaders and developing sound strategies in nonprofit management as well as fundraising and grant writing to increase organizational capacity of Native-led organizations.

We know that increased nonprofit development catalyzes the expansion of philanthropy within Tribal Nations and Native communities in the Northwest. Our aim, in this program, is to significantly increase the impact that we have on Native nonprofits that we work with by creating a delivery model that captures our past experiences into a more efficient use of resources.
